The project was well attended by almost half of the members. More power to the project committee members including Engr. Ken Sueno, PS Allan Perez.

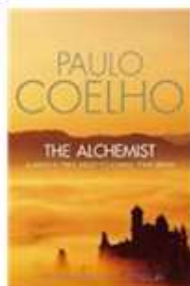

The Alchemist, Maktub

The Alchemist is a novel by Paulo Coelho first published in 1988. Originally written in Portuguese, it has been translated into 71 languages as of 2011. An allegorical novel, The Alchemist follows a young Andalusian shepherd named Santiago in his journey to Egypt, after having a recurring dream of finding treasure there.

Allegory is a device in which characters or events represent or symbolize ideas and concepts. Allegory has been used widely throughout the history of art, and in all forms of artwork. A reason for this is that allegory has an immense power of illustrating complex ideas and concepts in a digestible, concrete way.

"Maktub" means, "it is written" an excellent title for very short incidents described in this book, all of them carry deep messages about life. Some incidents or small, very small stories are funny, but when you stop smiling, they carry deeper meanings about life, what an amazing way to write about life when reader smiles every now and then and then a message about life goes deeper in his or her soul.

This is the inspiration that made me decide to adopt the title "The Alchemist, Maktub" for my Valley Wheel Column this Rotary 2012 with the RI theme "Peace through Service". 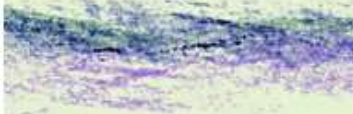

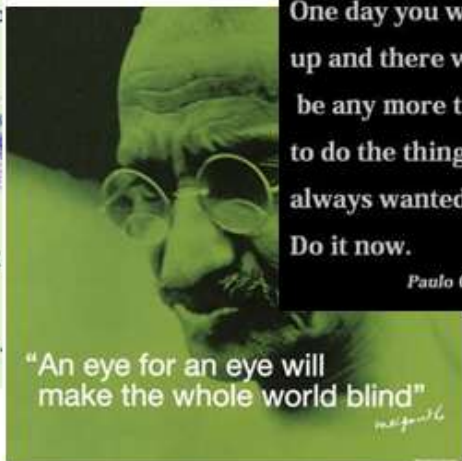

Bloggers World

What is a blog? According to The Interactive Media Lab of the University of Florida, creator of Project Blog, a web log or blog is a website with dated entries in reverse chronological order. It is updated frequently, linked to similar sites, and archived. More importantly, the blogger can post blogs on her own time—and rewrite and edit as often as he wishes.

If you want to blog, these are what you need: internet connection, an account at a blogging website, and your thoughts and opinions about anything under the sun. And here is how to get you started:

1. Create a blog account. Blogger, Blog-City, LiveJournal, and Blogspot are some of the more popular sites that let you set up your own online journal for free. Simply follow the user-friendly instructions in their homepage to begin. If you prefer posting pictures with just a little text try Phlog.net or Buzznet.com, where you can submit pictures via your cell phone.

2. Personalize your site. As you become more blog-savvy, you can gradually add links to your favourite sites and other fun blog tricks. You can learn HTML if you like, so you can tweak the code that sets the appearance of your website. Visit these websites to find out how you can spiff up your own:

- Visitors' Counter at www.sitemeter.com. So you'll be able to monitor how many hits or visits your site gets. The higher the number goes, the more inspired you'll be.
- Comments Board at www.tag-board.com. So readers can leave comments that can cheer on a blogger to write more and write better.
- Zeitgeist Photo Collage at www.flickr.com. So you'll be able to show off all your cool photos.

3. Share your blog! Invite visitors by attaching your address as a signature at the bottom of e-mails you send, leaving it every time you post a comment in another person's blog: or asking site owners to link their blog to yours and vice versa.

A word of caution: Since a lot of surfers may come upon your site, it's best not to put your exact location, phone numbers and other pertinent information for security reasons. Source: Good housekeeping

- Undertake an innovative approach to attracting and retaining members and achieve a net gain of at least one member between 1 July and 1 March.
- Analyze why members are leaving the club, and create an action plan to maintain a member retention rate of at least 85 percent.
- Encourage member engagement by ensuring that every member has personally participated in at least one service activity and one club social activity.
- Increase the diversity of your club's membership by recruiting at least two new members who belong to a demographic group (gender, age, profession, ethnicity, etc.) that is underrepresented in the club.
- Initiate a new-member welcome and mentoring program.
- Initiate an outreach and communication program for club alumni **or** recruit at least one Rotary or Foundation alumnus age 40 or younger into your club.
- Adopt a program² for the leadership development of all members **or** ensure that each club member is assigned a specific role in your club's leadership development goals for the year, either in a leadership position or as a member of a club committee, subcommittee, or project initiative.
