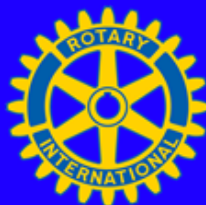

1. In compliance with the approval of the Board of RC Marikina, attendance in the weekly physical fitness program and fellowship will be credited as attendance in lieu of a weekly RC Marikina club meeting. To be eligible for make-up or extra attendance for a Rotary weekly meeting, the member must spend at least 60% of the time during the walk or the breakfast fellowship. The attendance list will be submitted to the RC Marikina attendance chairman every week by the club secretary
 2. Each regular member shall contribute Ph 200 every week to pay for the cost of the weekly breakfast and other club expenses. Any excess weekly collection will be included in the Club's funds and deposited in the club's bank accounts to be used for other Club-related purposes, such as part of Christmas, Anniversary or other Party expenses or out-of-town trips or outings. In case a member is absent during the week, he shall still pay 50% or Ph 100 to be collected during the subsequent fellowship meetings.
 3. An associate member shall contribute Ph 100 during the weekly fellowship.
 4. Guests of members shall pay Ph 100 to cover (more or less) the actual cost of breakfast
 5. During weekly fellowships, when a member has a birthday or wishes to pay for the entire weekly breakfast, the members shall still contribute 50% or Ph 100 to be added to the Club's funds.
 6. Every month, the club shall honour their members with birthday during the month with a birthday cake to celebrate.
- All regular club members shall be provided the official club uniform sweatshirts, which shall be worn during the weekly walk and fellowship. Hand towels and other paraphernalia, which may be solicited from club sponsors or paid for by the club, shall likewise be given to each regular and associate member. In case no sponsor is secured for an item to be given to each member, these shall be

charged to each member at actual or club-subsidized or minimal cost.

All members of the Rotary Club of Marikina and their spouses are eligible for membership on a voluntary basis.

As of last Sunday, July 12, 2012, the Sunday Walkers Club has total funds of Ph 4,420 in the custody of our Treasurer. We are fortunate that, our first two club breakfast fellowships were shouldered by PP Flor and PP Dante amounting to about Ph 4,200. Last Sunday's breakfast of about Ph 2,000 was shouldered by Birthday celebrant PP George. The initial Ph 420 in the funds was provided by the initial contributions of the four original members during the initial organizational meeting. The initial batch of 25 sweatshirts was provided by Olo's Café owner, former Rotarian Romy Cruz, who promised to be back in January 2013 and re-join our club. The club shouldered the cost of the sweatshirt printing of Ph 1,250. PP Larry is sponsoring the cost of 30 hand towels (Ph 4,500), while PP Ver will sponsor the cost of the personalized embroidery – Club name and member's name (about less than Ph 2,000). PP Onie gave the SWC members present to share 2 big boxes of avocados.


