Opening the door to polio eradication



It's been more than two years since the last polio case was reported in Côte d'Ivoire. Time enough for people to become complacent about immunizations. But that would be a mistake – a potentially deadly mistake.

“The public sometimes doesn't understand why, after so many rounds of polio immunization, they are still being asked to bring their children to the immunization post,” says Marie-

rière Richmond-Ahoua, chair of Rotary's National PolioPlus Committee in Côte d'Ivoire.

As a long-time advocate for polio eradication, Richmond-Ahoua knows you can't let up against this tenacious and crippling disease. With Nigeria one of three remaining polio-endemic countries, the possibility of fresh outbreaks in Côte d'Ivoire is a constant threat. The only way to keep the poliovirus out of the country are regular immunizations of all children under age five.

During National Immunization Days (NIDs) in April, thousands of volunteers and health workers, together with Rotary and Rotaract members, canvassed the streets throughout the country in search of children to immunize. They traveled from house to house knocking on doors in shanty-towns and rural villages. But gaining entrance to these homes required another round of convincing.

“Côte d'Ivoire has just experienced a conflict and people are still cautious. They don't want to open their door to just anyone,” says Richmond-Ahoua. But once they see the polio T-shirts and hats that Rotary clubs supply to identify vaccinators, she says they feel safe opening their doors.

Communication is also key to mobilizing public support. Rotary members use the media, television, radio, and even griots, African tribal storytellers, to encourage participation in immunizations. As a result, 7.5 million children received two drops of oral polio vaccine, along with vitamin A supplements and de-worming tablets, during the NIDs.

Green groups urge more domestic action on climate change

(Part 1)

Meanwhile, Worldwide Fund for Nature CEO Lory Tan said the IPCC report must drive home the point that Filipinos have to adapt to climate change now, even if the country is not a major contributor to climate change.

"Whether or not the Philippines is responsible for what the IPCC report confirms, we will get hit. And, we will get hit hard. Extreme rainfall, intense storms, sea level rise. We know this already. How do we respond to this change?" he said.

"Business as usual will no longer cut it. We need to mainstream next practice."

He added that the country must veer away from fossil fuel-derived energy. The combustion of fossil fuels releases greenhouse gas. From the beginning of the Industrial Revolution in 1750 until 2012, the burning of fossil fuels led to a 40% increase in the atmospheric concentration of carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas.

There are 3 solar power plants under construction in the Philippines, he told Rappler. The government and private sector must invest in more renewable energy sources like these to meet the effects of climate change head on.

"The same applies to the way we manage water supply and water quality. We need to diversify our water supply sources," he said in relation to the threat of more droughts in the future.

Tony La Viña, environmentalist and dean of Ateneo de Manila University's School of Government said on Facebook, "My first impression is that the science has greatly improved, uncertainties have been narrowed, climate change is definitely worsening, the scenarios are bleak but there are options we can still take to avoid worst case scenarios. The main message is: act now."

Dominant views

But he observed with worry the "overwhelming dominance of scientists from the North or developed countries" in the list of drafting and draft contributing authors of the report.

He noted that that while 31 of the drafting authors come from developed countries, only 3 are from developing countries. In the draft contributing authors list, 35.5 are from developed countries while 1.5 are from developing countries. The 0.5 is because one of the authors hails from Australia and Brazil.

"I worry that this dominance will be used to undermine what I think is a good, solid report," he said.

"In view, even in scientific matters, it matters where you come from and the perspective you bring as that is still a filter you use in making conclusions. This is especially important when issues like historical responsibility and carbon budgets are addressed."

The Best Android Tips and Tricks (continuation)

How to Type Special Characters

If you often need to switch between the on-screen Alphabet and Number keyboards just to type a comma in a sentence, then why not check out below to find out more?

While on the Alphabet keyboard:

- , (comma) => touch and hold the Full-stop key (.)
- ' (single quotation mark) => touch and hold the Full-stop key, and slide to choose the single quotation mark (')
- " (double quotation mark) => touch and hold the Full-stop key, and slide to choose the double quotation mark (")
- Turn caps lock on/off => double-tap the Shift key to lock, single-tap to unlock.
- Special letters not on the keyboard? => touch and hold a key, then slide to choose a variation (*See the screenshot*).
- Need just a digit or symbol from the Number keyboard? => touch the ?123 key and slide to a digit or symbol key, and you're back to the Alphabet keyboard automatically.

While on the Number keyboard:

- Symbols not on the keyboard? => touch and hold a key, then slide to choose a variation, or tap the #\< key to find out more.
- Often type an equation? => touch and hold the #\< key, tap a sign and you're back to the Number keyboard when you release the #\< key.
- Need just a letter from the Alphabet keyboard? => touch the ABC key and slide to a letter key, and you're back to the Number keyboard automatically.

Supplementary immunization campaigns like this one are part of the comprehensive 2013-18 [Polio Eradication and Endgame Strategic Plan](#). The plan outlines what is needed to eradicate all polio disease by 2018. In June the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced a [new fundraising agreement](#) with Rotary. If successful, the campaign, which matches donations two-to-one (up to \$35 million per year), will help raise \$525 million for polio eradication.

“Polio eradication is not an option, it’s an obligation,” Richmond-Ahoua says. “When you consider what’s been done in Côte d’Ivoire, despite the many obstacles we’ve faced, you are deeply convinced that polio will soon be eradicated.”

How to Cut, Copy and Paste


This looks simple but can be tricky sometimes when you use different apps. In general, these steps can be used in Email or some other apps:

1. Double-tap or touch-and-hold to select a word.
2. Drag the handles to adjust the area if needed, then tap Cut or Copy.
3. Tap an insert point, and drag the handle to adjust it if needed.
4. Select Paste (*Hint*: tap the handle when the 'Paste' button doesn't appear).

Note: When working in a web browser such as Android's Browser, use touch-and-hold to select a word since "double-tap" has been used to enlarge or reduce a webpage.

How to Turn Off Auto-Correction

When you're typing through, the system checks your spelling and suggests a few words. Unless you've selected one of them, the highlighted suggested word overwrites your word when you finish typing it followed by a space, punctuation mark or return character. If you feel that's annoying, you can turn off Auto-Correction.

1. Open the app Settings and select 'Language & input' under PERSONAL.
2. Tap the Quick Settings icon  next to 'Android keyboard'.
3. Select 'Auto correction' under TEXT CORRECTION.
4. Select 'Off' to turn off 'Auto-Correction'.

Note: As an alternative, whenever a word is replaced not to your liking, you can tap the Delete key immediately after which and the system returns the word you've typed.
