We were supposed to have our district breakfast meeting last Saturday at 8:00 AM at the Valle Verde Country Club. However, because of super typhoon Yolanda, DG Louie thought it best to move it to next Saturday instead at the same time and venue. As we all know by now, Yolanda wreaked havoc and destruction to eastern, central and western Visayas provinces, hitting its first landfall at Guian, Samar. Yolanda left after hitting its sixth landfall in Busuanga, part of the Calamian Group of islands located in northern Palawan. According to news reports almost 95% of Tacloban city was destroyed by the strong winds at more than 215 km. per hour and storm surge that engulf the city with more than 10 feet high of sea water. Up to now the entire area is still reeling from this disaster with the surviving residents asking for food, water, medicine and shelter in order to survive. DG Louie has again asked Rotarians for relief assistance to the victims of this tragedy. Vice Mayor and PP Fabi Cadiz and his team of Rotarian doctors, including Dir. Val Barcinal and Rtn. Joel Rellve, will leave on Friday to lead in this effort to help the victims with a four-truck relief caravan and medical mission. Let us support their humanitarian mission by donating relief goods which they will deliver and distribute to the victims in the devastated areas of the Visayas.

Last Monday, I was invited by DGSR Dindo Santos to attend and give a message to the first orientation meeting of the proposed Rotary eClub of Marikina. It was a very successful first meeting where eight prospective members showed up, including five second generation future Rotarians. HISTORY OF THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

Besides Rotary International, there is another institution that Rotarians pride in – **The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International. This is its story --**

In 1917, **Arch C. Klumph**, Rotary's 6th president, proposed to the R.I. convention in Atlanta, Georgia, USA, and the creation of an "endowment fund for Rotary...for the purpose of doing good in the world in charitable, educational and other avenues of community service." A few months later, the endowment received its first contribution of \$ 26.50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, USA.

In 1928, when the endowment fund had grown to \$ 5,739.07, the endowment was renamed – "**The Rotary Foundation.**" Five trustees, including Klumph, were appointed to manage the trust fund.

Two years later, the Foundation made its first grant of US \$500. to the International Society of Crippled Children. In the next two decades, the Foundation remained a modest institution. The advent of the great depression and WWII virtually neutralized efforts to enlarge the foundation.

After Paul Harris died in January 1947, contributions began pouring in. In homage to the man who founded Rotary, many Rotarians donated to the Foundation through the "Paul Harris Memorial Fund." By June 1948, more than US \$ 1.0 million was raised, much of which going to provide relief for needy people who had suffered during WWII.

We take pride in claiming that we are members of the Rotary Foundation whose motto is to do good in this world. The mission of the Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, peace and goodwill through the improvement of health, support of education and alleviation of poverty. Our Foundation addresses the greatest needs in all parts of the world. It's world reach is farther than the United Nations and we have gone to places where political and religious groups cannot. We have been trusted by International organizations, governments and non government organizations all over the world. Our partner in the eradication of Polio, the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation has contributed more than half billion dollars to our Foundation and recognized our Foundation as the leader in the fight against polio.

Today, the Rotary Foundation has net assets of around US \$ 250 million. Cumulative contributions of Rotarians to The Rotary Foundation has exceeded US \$ 3 billion while program expenditures since 1947 has reached \$ 2.8 billion. Total number of Paul Harris Fellows 1,351,700, Major Donors 16,800, Bequest Society 9,595, Benefactors 87,900 and Arch Klumph Society members 390.

Typhoon Haiyan (Yolanda)



Typhoon Haiyan ([Chinese](#): 海燕; literally "[petrel](#)")^[1] of November 2013, known in the [Philippines](#) as **Typhoon Yolanda**, is one of the strongest [tropical cyclones](#) ever recorded. The thirtieth named storm, thirteenth typhoon, and fifth super-typhoon of the [2013 Pacific typhoon season](#), Haiyan originated as an area of low pressure east-southeast of [Pohnpei](#) in the western [Pacific Ocean](#) on November 2. Tracking generally westward, the disturbance steadily developed within an environment of light wind shear and warm sea surface temperatures, becoming a tropical depression early the following day. After becoming a tropical storm and attaining the name *Haiyan* at 0000 UTC on November 4, the system began a period of [rapid intensification](#) that brought it to typhoon intensity by 1800 UTC on November 5. With an expanding and deepening central dense overcast and clear eye visible on satellite, the [Joint Typhoon Warning Center](#) (JTWC) upgraded Haiyan to a super typhoon—a typhoon in which maximum sustained winds attain or exceed 240 km/h (150 mph)—early on November 6. After entering [PAGASA](#)'s region of responsibility, the JTWC upgraded Haiyan to a Category 5 equivalent on the [Saffir-Simpson hurricane wind scale](#).

Steered by a subtropical ridge to the cyclone's north, the eye of Haiyan passed over the northern portion of [Palau](#), where extensive wind damage was observed. Thereafter, it continued to intensify; at 1200 UTC on November 7, the [Japan Meteorological Agency](#) (JMA) upgraded the storm's maximum ten-minute sustained winds to 235 km/h (145 mph), the highest in relation to the cyclone. At 1800 UTC, the JTWC estimated the system's one-minute sustained winds to 315 km/h (195 mph), unofficially making Haiyan the fourth most intense tropical cyclone ever observed. Several hours later, the eye of the cyclone made its first landfall in the [Philippines](#) at [Guiuan, Eastern Samar](#), without any change in intensity; if verified, this would make Haiyan the strongest tropical cyclone to make a landfall on record, which may surpass the old record of 305 km/h (190 mph) set by [Hurricane Camille](#) in [1969](#). On November 8, the cyclone entered the [South China Sea](#) and was downgraded to a Category 4 typhoon by the JTWC. Readings indicated that Typhoon Haiyan dropped to Category 3 as it traversed the South China Sea, with gusts of up to 210 km/h (130 mph) and 1-minute

How to Edit Bookmarks and Folders in Android's Browser

Just like most browsers, the default Browser in Android allows you to add bookmarks and folders easily for getting to the websites fast when browsing.



Add a bookmark/folder

On the page you like to bookmark, tap the Menu button  and select 'Save to bookmarks'.

Change the Label if needed.

Click 'OK' to save to Bookmarks, or select 'Add to' then 'Other folder', browse to a folder or add a new folder and tap 'OK'.

Remove a bookmark/folder

Tap the Tabs button , then the Bookmarks button .

Touch and hold a bookmark or a folder, then select 'Delete bookmark' or 'Delete folder' from the pop-up menu.

Press 'OK' to confirm.

How to Add a Web Clip Icon to Home Screen

If you frequently visit a web page, you can tap a web clip or bookmark icon on your home screen and quickly access the page without the need to touch the Browser icon. This web clip icon can be added to your home screen easily:

On the page you often visit, tap the Menu button  in Android's Browser.

Select 'Save to bookmarks'.

Edit the Label if necessary, then select 'Add to' and tap "Home Screen".

Next time you visit the same web page, just tap the web clip icon on your home screen. Some websites including Gizmo's Freeware have a web clip icon which has been customized for you (see the screenshot).

Rotary Club of Marikina COMELEC Guidelines for Election of Officers & Directors for RY 2014-2015



Qualification of Candidates

1. He must be a member of the club in good standing.
2. He must have paid all his dues and all other assessments (including Inductions, Anniversaries and Christmas Parties) to the club as of date of election.
3. He must have attended 50% of the regular meeting out of which 50% must be in the home club and provided he has not incurred four (4) consecutive absences.

Voter's Eligibility

1. Only members in good standing as of election date shall be entitled to vote. Members who have paid all his dues and all other assessments (including inductions, Anniversaries and Christmas Parties) are considered members in good standing and will be allowed to vote.
2. Absent members are not allowed to vote (No proxy voting)

Election Process

1. The annual election shall be held during our club meeting on December 5, 2013
2. Nomination of Officers and Directors shall be presented by the members from the floor during the said meeting or in written form before the election day for all elective positions duly accepted in writing by the nominee.
3. Floor nomination of qualified members to absentia is allowed provided that there is a written acceptance for his nomination that will be submitted to the COMELEC during the election.
4. The position to be voted for are the following: PRESIDENT-NOMINEE, VICE PRESIDENT, SECRETARY, TREASURER AND FIVE (5) DIRECTORS.
5. Members nominated on the floor in any particular position must express personally his acceptance of the nomination before he is considered a candidate.
6. A roll call of members will be done after the closing of nomination for a particular position.
7. Methods of voting in electing the Officers and Directors shall be by SECRET BALLOTING and will be done one (1) minute after finishing the roll call.
8. A candidate who has been voted upon by the majority of the votes cast shall be declared winner in their respective positions.
9. A tie will be broken by a second balloting. If there is another tie on the second balloting, it will be broken by toss coin. One candidate chooses if he will go for head or tail and the other candidates will toss the coin to the floor.
10. In case of second balloting, only voters in the first balloting will be allowed to cast their votes in the second balloting to break the tie; latecomers will not be allowed to vote. Although late comers can still vote in the next position to be voted upon.
11. DECISION OF THE COMELEC IS FINAL unless appealed to the club members whose decision shall be final when reversed or modified by TWO-THIRDS votes of the members within a reasonable period of time as determined by the Board of Directors.

sustained winds of up to 190 km/h (120 mph).

The cyclone caused devastation in the [Philippines](#), particularly on [Samar Island](#) and [Leyte](#), where at least 10,000 people are estimated to have died in the city of [Tacloban](#) alone.

Bodies in the streets, a plague of looters and 10,000 dead in one city alone: Filipinos struggle to cope with huge typhoon that was 'like a tsunami'

How to Send Instant Messages

Besides third-party apps, Messenger developed by Google gives you a real-time instant messaging service via Wi-Fi, 3G or 4G for Android users. To use this service and send an instant message from your Android device is pretty straightforward.

Tap the Messenger app icon.

Tap the plus sign and add a person or a group of people from your circles.

Add text or photos and tap the Send button.

Note: Messenger appears as a standalone app that comes with your Android system, or as a component of the Google+ app that can be downloaded from the Google Play store.
