Elevating the Rotary name was the first critical step in re-energizing the logo. Not only did scaling up the word Rotary in proportion to the wheel symbol put the more proprietary identity component front and center, it unified the two parts of the organization - Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation - under one powerful banner. The wheel is applied boldly as a mark of excellence - a pledge of commitment, a symbol of leadership, a sign of social and ethical responsibility. We also made sure that it was optimized for digital use. (SEIGEL+GALE)

Rotary's new visual identity has everyone talking. Some Rotarians like it and are already using it, as you can see in the examples above. Others aren't so sure. Even RI President Ron Burton admits to being skeptical during the early stages of the Strengthening Rotary initiative. But after asking many tough questions, he's become a believer.

"At the end of the day, we're going to be way ahead on our public image and what people think and know about Rotary," says Burton.

As you begin incorporating the new guidelines into your communications, keep the following in mind:

Clubs do not need to discard any unused materials. We encourage you to follow the new guidelines on materials you create in the future.

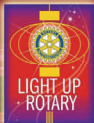
Clubs can use the free fonts recommended in the guidelines as an alternative to the two recommended fonts that require licensing fees. It's your choice.

Your Rotary pin will not change. It remains the blue-and-gold metal logo that identifies Rotarians worldwide.

The Strengthening Rotary initiative extends far beyond our visual identity. It offers a new way to tell our Rotary story.

Updated guidelines highlighting the flexibility of the voice and visual identity recommendations will be available in the coming weeks with more tools and templates to follow.

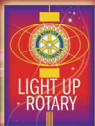

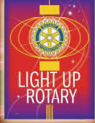

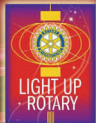

DIGITALLY YOURS

Last May 26 to 30, I attended the 5-day Basic Photography Workshop managed by Federation of Philippine Photographers Foundation, Inc. at Intramuros, Manila under National Commission for Culture and Arts (NCCA). I learned a lot of things about the ins and outs of photography which I think is essential to my position being Public Image Chair so we can document properly all our projects and promote the image of Rotary as well, specially that we are now celebrating our club's 50th Anniversary... not necessarily that I will be the only one who will do the shooting but rather ALL of us - with the basic knowledge which I am going to share in my column so we can shoot pictures the proper way.

BASICS OF PHOTOGRAPHY: THE COMPLETE GUIDE

With so many cameras available, figuring out how all the specifications and options translate into your everyday use is complicated. For our first lesson in the Basics of Photography, we're going to learn how cameras work and make sense of what that means in terms of choosing a camera to buy and how it affects your photographs.

The Parts

Your camera is made up of many parts, but there are a few in particular that we want to look at as they are the most important. We'll go into much more detail in a bit, but here's a basic overview of the parts we're going to look at:

- **The body** is the housing for your camera. While it has little effect on the quality of your photos, it does affect things like ease of use and comfort.
- **The lens** is the eye of the camera, and it's a very complex instrument. Different lenses can provide many different features, so it's important to know the differences between them. In future lessons, we'll also discuss how lenses work and how that affects your photographs.
- **The sensor** is basically the digital equivalent of film, in the sense that—like film—the sensor is exposed to light that comes through the lens and it records that exposure. The exposure is then processed and saved to flash memory (generally an SD or Compact Flash card). The caliber and size of the sensor are also very important, as these things significantly impact the quality of your photos.
- **The flash card** is where you save your images, and it's a component most people don't think about too much when buying a camera, aside from choosing an amount of storage that suits their needs. Flash cards range in read and write speeds as well, however, and a slow cards can significantly degrade your camera's performance. We'll take a look at what card classes mean and the minimum speed you need for different purposes.
- **The battery** matters in a camera just like any other electronic device. While this is a simple part to understand, we'll dive into it a little more deeply to figure out actual, practical battery life for cameras and when cameras with less-powerful batteries may be a better option.

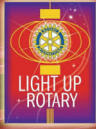
