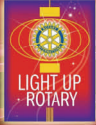

## The New Generation, a review

Now is September and its 112 days before Christmas. It is only the Philippines where the Christmas season is unofficially started soon as “ber” season sets in. you can hear Christmas songs being played on the radio and Christmas décor are already set up in the department store.

However, in Rotary September is the New Generations Month. Every year, thousands of talented and dedicated young people, ages 12-30, have an incredible experience in a New Generations program.

New Generations refers to the youngest generation in the family of Rotary. Many are participants in Rotary’s youth and young adult programs: Interact, Rotaract, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), and Rotary Youth Exchange. Others are serviceminded young people involved in Rotary club and district activities.

Past RI President Luis Vicente Giay coined the term **New Generations** when he shared his belief that the future of Rotary relied on involving young people in the organization’s programs and activities. At the 1996 RI Convention in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, he said:

“Our vision for the future, now more than ever, is the difference between success and failure. The New Generations are our investment in the future. Let us begin to build that future today.”

**New Generations Service** became Rotary’s Fifth Avenue of Service in 2010. It is defined in article 5 of the Standard Rotary Club Constitution:

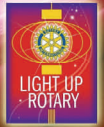
*New Generations Service recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities, involvement in community and international service projects, and exchange programs that enrich and foster world peace and cultural understanding.*

Rotary clubs should be committed to involving youth and young adults in their vocational, community, and international service projects, and to providing programs and resources that support them.

Rotarians have long been committed to serving youth in their communities. The RI Strategic Plan encourages clubs to balance activities in all five Avenues of Service, but some fall under more than one. The New Generations Avenue of Service acknowledges the exceptional work that Rotarians do with youth and young adults while encouraging clubs to spread their reach even further. It also encompasses a fundamental idea: that every Rotarian has a responsibility to support the personal and professional success of young people while recognizing the diversity of their needs.

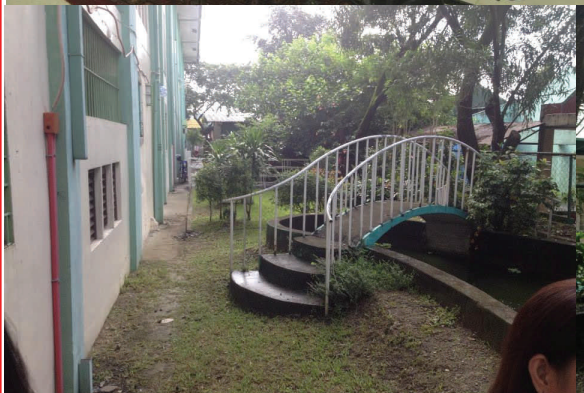

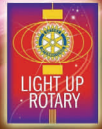

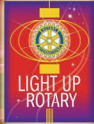

## Interact

Interact is Rotary's service club for youth ages 12-18. Interact clubs can be community-based or school-based. Individual Rotary clubs sponsor Interact clubs and provide them with support and guidance, but each Interact club is self-governing and self-supporting. The goals of Interact include developing leadership skills and personal integrity, demonstrating helpfulness and respect for others, understanding the value of individual responsibility and hard work, and advancing international understanding and goodwill.

Your Rotary club can support Interact by

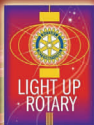
- Inviting local Interactors or your district Interact chair to speak at club meetings
- Including local Interactors in a community service project
- Sponsoring an Interact club (Schedule a meeting with local school administrators to get started.)
- Holding a career day for Interactors
- Attending Interact club meetings, and inviting Interactors to attend your Rotary club meetings
- Assigning Rotary club members to mentor Interactors

## Rotaract

Rotaract is Rotary's service club for young adults ages 18-30. University-based clubs consist of undergraduate and graduate students who meet on campus. Community based clubs consist of young adults from various backgrounds, regardless of their professional or academic status. All Rotaract clubs are sponsored by a local Rotary club and conduct community and international service projects. Rotaract clubs also focus on leadership and professional development activities.

Your Rotary club can support Rotaract by

- Posting information about Rotaract at local colleges, universities, or community centers
- Creating a club Rotaract committee
- Sponsoring a Rotaract club
- Inviting Rotaractors to club meetings, working together on service projects and club activities, and taking other steps to build relationships
- Mentoring Rotaractors to build their professional and leadership skills, and providing training opportunities to Rotaract club officers
- Welcoming former Rotaractors into your Rotary club

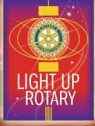

## Basics of Photography: Your Camera's Automatic and Assisted Settings

(continued from last week)

### Shooting Modes



**Scene modes** generally have icons to represent their purpose, such as a mountain for landscapes or a fast-moving person for sports. Scene modes can be useful if you want the camera to assist you in photographing the types of photos each mode is designed for, but hopefully after you're done with these lessons you won't need or want to use them anymore.

**Shutter priority** allows you to set the shutter speed and ISO but allows the camera to set the aperture automatically. This mode is useful if the shutter speed is the most important consideration when taking a photo. This is often the case when you want to make sure you take a photo fast enough to capture motion but do not care about the aperture. This is useful for photography sports, dance, or anything with a lot of movement.

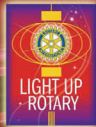


**Aperture priority** allows you to set the aperture and ISO but lets the camera set the shutter speed automatically. This is useful when the aperture is the most important consideration in your photograph. The aperture can have some of the greatest visual impact on your photographs because it is one of the largest contributing factors to depth of field. A wide aperture (represented by a low f-stop like f/1.8) will produce a photo where your subject is in sharp focus but the background is very much out of focus. This is useful for portraits, or focusing on a single object in an otherwise busy frame. A narrow aperture (represented by a higher f-stop, like f/8) will produce a photo where most everything appears to be in focus. This is useful for landscapes, or any other situation where keeping everything in focus is desirable. Wider apertures also let in more light, so they're useful when you don't have much and want to avoid using a flash. Aperture priority is one of the best shooting modes your camera has because you can still control your ISO settings (light sensitivity) and the shutter speed is often something that's best left for the camera to decide unless you have a reason to choose it yourself. Don't worry if you don't fully understand this yet. We'll be discussing aperture, shutter speed, and ISO in much more detail in the next lesson.



**Manual mode** lets you set everything, and we'll be discussing this mode in detail in the next lesson. It's worth noting, however, that this mode does not imply manual focus with DSLR cameras. Switching between manual and automatic focus is generally a dedicate hardware toggle switch on your lens and not on the camera. If you want to focus manually on a DSLR, you can use any shooting mode you want if the switch is set to manual on the lens.



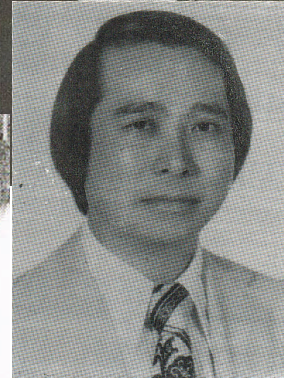
