# GOLDEN PRESIDENT

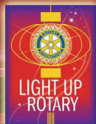

## THE OFFICIAL VISIT

The governor's official visit is the personal visit of the governor to each Rotary club in the district, individually or in groups, for the purpose of:

- Focusing attention on important Rotary issues
- Providing special attention to weak or struggling clubs
- Motivating Rotarians to participate in service activities
- Ensuring that the constitution and bylaws of the clubs comply with the constitutional documents
- Personally recognizing the outstanding contributions of Rotarians in the district

The governor or assistant governor should review the progress of the club toward its goals during the official visit. To maximize the impact of the governor's presence, visits should coincide with events such as charter nights, induction ceremonies, new member orientation programs, citation or award presentations, special programs, Rotary Foundation events, or intercity meetings. Multiclub or intercity meetings should emphasize strong attendance from all participating clubs, not just the host club. Governors should also use this time to hear from clubs about how the district could better support them.

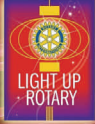

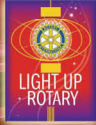

# DISTRICT GOVERNOR MARILOU CO



Our District Governor Elect was born to a family of entrepreneurs in Concepcion, Tarlac, the home town of our hero Ninoy Aquino. Her father was a tireless hardworking businessman who dealt in various businesses like rice trading, hardware, auto supply, real estate and transportation.

For her elementary schooling, she went to a school run by Belgian sisters—the Little Flower Academy—Holy Spirit.

A consistent first honor, she graduated Valedictorian in high school. In high school, she excelled in both Mathematics and English subjects, a rare combination. She finished BS Bio Science at the University of Sto. Tomas graduating as a Magna Cum Laude, barely missing Summa Cum Laude by a few points. She took up her post graduate studies on Biological and Physical Sciences at UST. She was instructress at both the San Juan de Letran College and the University of Sto Tomas.

As mentioned, her parents were involved in different businesses, but she carved her own, starting with both a jewelry store and a jewelry loan company in Caloocan, where her husband PDG Tony, had a candy factory. Now she is into jewelry manufacturing specializing in diamonds, pearls and gold.

She has an intense passion for excellence in whatever she does. She is very successful in business, specifically in jewelry industry. She has several shops showcasing her personal designs and creations.

The family is engaged in other businesses, but DG Marilou Co is concentrating only in jewelry, leaving PDG Tony to focus in their other endeavors.

They are blessed with three intelligent and responsible children, who are all established in their own right—Oliver, Atty. SherryLou and Raymund.

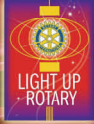
Long before she became a Rotarian, she already led and participated in a range of Rotary and spouses' activities. In 1989, she was appointed by Gov. Ruf Luna as the Chairperson of the Anns' Participation Committee. She then conceived planned and implemented activities for the spouses.

She initiated both the Governor's Ball and the Talent Night in Discon 1989 that was held in Baguio Convention Center. 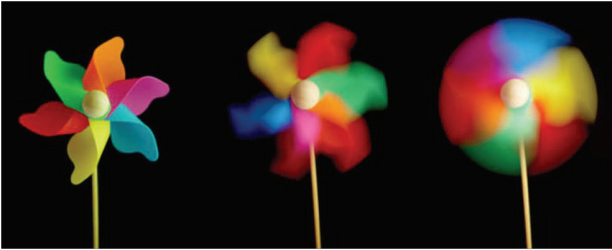

## Basics of Photography: Your Camera's Manual Settings



### Shutter Speed

When you press the shutter button on your camera and take a picture, the aperture blades take a specific amount of time to close. This amount of time is known as your shutter speed. Generally it is a fraction of a second, and if you're capturing fast motion it needs to

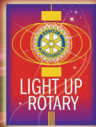
be at most 1/300th of a second. If you're not capturing any motion, you can sometimes get away with as long of an exposure as 1/30th of a second. When you increase your shutter speed—the length of time where the sensor is exposed to light—two important things happen.

First, the sensor is exposed to more light because it's been given more time. This is useful in low light situations. Second, the sensor is subject to more motion which causes motion blur. This can happen either because your subject is in motion or because you cannot hold the camera still. This is fine if you're photographing a landscape at night and the camera is placed on a tripod, as neither the camera nor your subject is going to move. On the other hand, slow shutter speeds pose a problem when you're shooting handheld and/or your subject is moving. This is why you wouldn't want a shutter speed any slower than 1/30th of a second when photographing handheld (unless you're known for your remarkably still hands).

In general, you want to use the fastest shutter speed you can but there are plenty of circumstances where you'd choose a slower shutter speed. Here are a few examples:

1. You want motion blur for artistic purposes, such as blurring a flowing stream while keeping everything else sharp and un-blurred. To accomplish this you'd use a slow shutter speed like 1/30th of a second and use a narrow aperture to prevent yourself from overexposing the photograph. *Note: This example is a good reason to use the Shutter Priority shooting mode discussed in the previous lesson.*
2. You want an overexposed and potentially blurred photograph for artistic purposes.
3. You're shooting in low light and it's necessary.
4. You're shooting in low light and it's *not* necessary, but you want to keep noise to a minimum. Therefore you set your ISO (film speed equivalent) to a low setting and you reduce your shutter speed to compensate (and let in more light).

These aren't the only reasons but a few common ones. The important thing to remember is a slow shutter speed means more light at the risk of motion blur. A fast shutter speed means low risk of motion blur while sacrificing light.

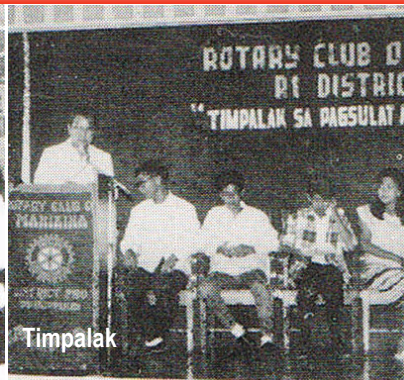

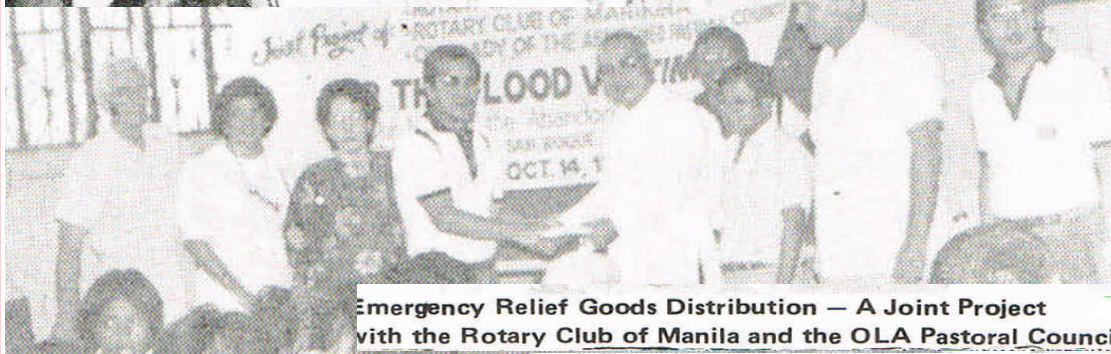

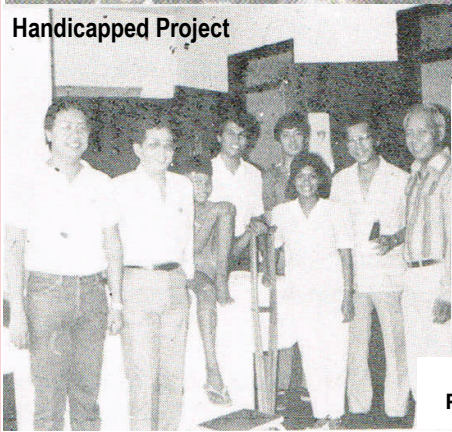
