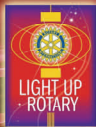

Last Monday October 20, 2014, I was invited to attend the interclub meeting of Zone 8, Mandaluyong by my classmates. Their guest speaker was the BIR Deputy Commissioner and Lt. Gov. Nelson Aspe of the Rotary Club Wackwack.

Yesterday, October 22, 2014, The Zone 4 and Zone 5 had the Vision Screening for the indigents of Marikina and Rizal at the Tahanan Walang Hagdan. More than 300 individuals were given the screening thru the help of the Asian Eye Institute. Marikina were able to send 34 patients. AG Dante Verano PP Jo Bernabe and most of the Best Class Presidents of Zone 4 accompanied them while lining up and waiting for their turn.

This coming October 26, 2014, We will be having our 4th 8 Kalusugan Medical Mission at Aglipay Church, Barangay Malanday, Marikina City. This time, the Rotary E-Club of Marikina, Rotary Club of Marikina Central and Rotary Club of Marikina Hilltop are our joint partners along with the regular partners in service like the MVMS, PLMAR College of Nursing, City Health Office and Embrace Foundation.

Lastly, on November 16, 2014, Sunday, is the District Rotary Day. It is a 3 in 1 event where in there will be a District Fun Run, a Job Fair and a Medical Mission. Our Club is the lead club for the Medical Mission. October 24 World Polio Day

To raise awareness and critically-needed funds to fight the crippling disease polio, Rotary International marked 24 October as World Polio Day. It will host a live-streamed global status update on the fight to end polio. Invited guests include Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners; celebrity ambassadors, including Ziggy Marley; polio survivors, including inspirational athlete MindaDentler; and Rotary members.

The effort raised for Rotary International, the volunteer fundraising arm of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative—a public-private partnership that also includes the World Health Organization, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, UNICEF, and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. This donation was tripled thanks to a 2:1 match by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, given through a current fundraising partnership with Rotary.

Overall, remarkable progress has been achieved in the fight against polio. Since 1988, the number of polio cases has been reduced 99% from 350,000 a year to about 400 in 2013. In 2014, Southeast Asia was certified polio-free after India eliminated the disease from its borders, an incredible feat for a country once considered the hardest place on earth to stop polio.

However, in 2014, the Director-General of the World Health Organization declared polio to be a public health emergency of international concern. As such, WHO urges polio-impacted countries to ensure travelers leaving their borders are immunized against the disease. This decision puts additional measures in place to ensure we protect our incredible progress against the disease, and also end the remaining 1% of cases.

Rotary, a humanitarian service organization with nearly 34,000 clubs in more than 200 countries and geographical areas, made polio eradication its top priority in 1985. Rotary has since contributed US\$1.3 billion, and its members have logged countless volunteer hours to help immunize more than two billion children in 122 countries.

A highly infectious disease, polio still strikes children mainly under the age of five in parts of Africa and South Asia. Polio can cause paralysis and sometimes death. There is no cure for polio, but for as little as 60 cents worth of oral vaccine, a child can be protected from the disease for life.

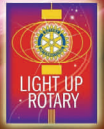
ROTARY AND POLIO BACKGROUND

When Rotary began the fight in 1985, polio affected 350,000 people, mostly children, in 125 countries every year. Since then, polio cases have dropped by more than 99 percent. To date, Rotary has contributed \$1.3 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect more than two billion children.

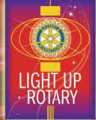

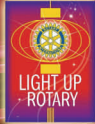

Classification

What first brought you to Rotary? In all likelihood, someone identified you as a prospective Rotarian because you are a respected member of your business or professional field — in Rotary parlance, your “classification.” Each Rotary club’s membership represents a cross-section of its community’s business and professional population, which ensures diversity in experiences and perspectives. Classification and vocational service go hand in hand. Just as Rotarians represent their vocations in Rotary, so do they represent Rotary in their vocations.

Integrity and ethics

Promoting integrity through ethical behavior is an essential part of what it means to be a Rotarian. Two standards developed by Rotarians — The Four-Way Test and the Rotary Code of Conduct — provide a road map for ethical behavior in the workplace and other areas of life.

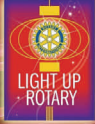
The Four-Way Test

The Four-Way Test was conceived in 1932 by businessman Herbert J. Taylor, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who served as Rotary International president in 1954-55. Having taken on the task of saving a company from bankruptcy, Taylor developed the test as an ethical guide to follow in all business matters. The company’s survival was credited to this simple philosophy.

Adopted by Rotary International in 1934, The Four-Way Test remains an essential standard against which Rotarians measure ethical behavior. It has been translated into dozens of languages and promoted by Rotarians worldwide.

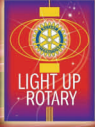

Basics of Photography: Composition and Technique

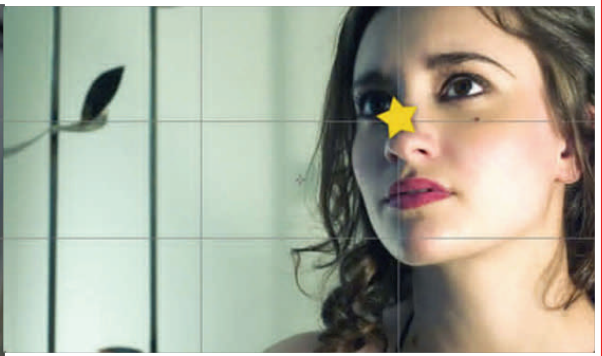
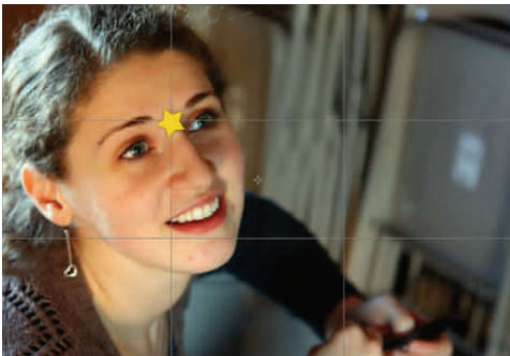
A well-composed photograph is really a matter of opinion, but there are a few tricks that tend to result in better pictures. That's what we're going to take a look at today.

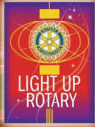
Rule of Thirds

The rule of thirds is the simplest rule of composition. All you do is take your frame and overlay a grid of nine equal sections. This means you split the vertical space into three parts and the horizontal space into three parts. Here's what that looks like:



Generally you want to place important elements where the grid intersects. Here are a few examples:



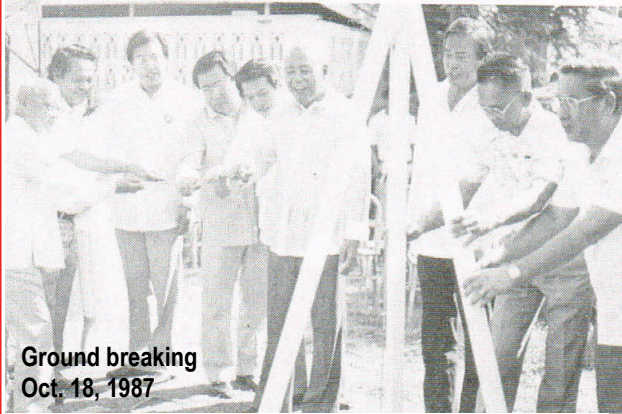

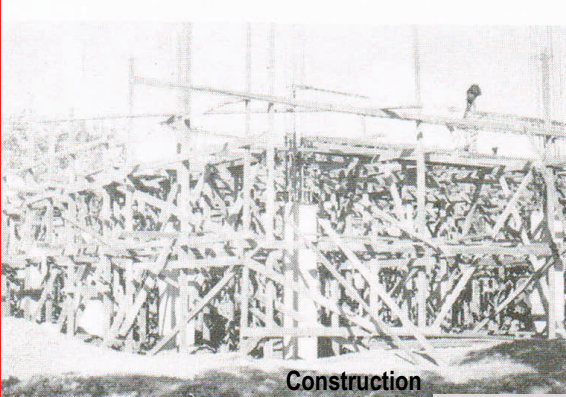

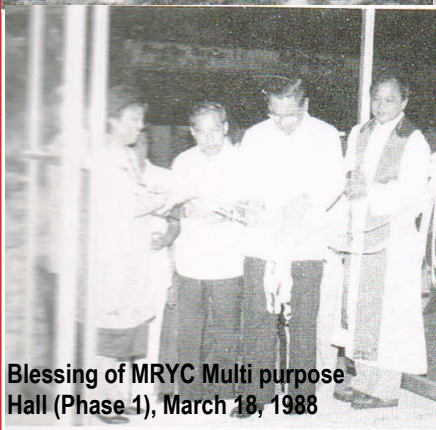
