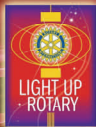
Everyone in Rotary District 3800 seems to be very busy this week. All the clubs are preparing for the District Wide Rotary Day. Most of the clubs are having a simultaneous Job Fair and Medical Mission on Saturday, November 15, 2014. On the other hand, the 16 clubs of zone 4 are busy preparing for the 3 in 1 Rotary Day on Sunday, November 16, 2014. The zone will have a Job Fair, a Medical Mission and host the District Fun Run. Tents will be provided for the Job Fair which will be in front of the city hall facing the justice hall. As of yesterday's committee meeting, 25 companies signified and registered to join. These companies are from within and outside Marikina City.

On the other hand, The Medical and Dental Mission will be inside the city hall quadrangle. Our club being the lead club for the Medical and Dental Mission, was able to distribute and invite all the 16 Barangays of Marikina, thru their Barangay Captains. They will bring those who need medical attention especially the elders and children of their Barangays. This was accomplished thru the effort of Club Chairman for Medical Mission PRO Joel Relve. Past President Ronie Masangkay offered to provide the services of his mobile X-ray van. Director August Iglane with his colleagues' in the Philippine Dental Association Marikina Chapter will handle the dental services. Past President Jimmy Capco will take care of the Cataract Screening services. Sec Val Barcinal will be in charge of the Pediatrics. Blood Letting services will be provided by Red Cross Marikina Chapter. And, Other Services will be provided by some Rotarians and partners in service.

The Fun Run will start at 7:00am from the main road between the City Hall and the Justice Hall. Runners of 5K and 3K will be wearing singlets, race bibs and other giveaways coming from some sponsors. After the Fun Run, Rotarians will proceed to the picnic area for the fellowship.

November 29, 2014 The Annual Giving Dinner will be at the Sofitel Hotel at 5:00pm. Ticket price is at P1,200.00 and is now with our secretariat Jean Josef. It is our club goal to be an EREY Club. Past President Ronie Masangkay, our chairman for the TRF is determined to meet our goal.

## TRF ANNUAL GIVING DINNER

The habit of giving freely without expecting anything in return is called **generosity**. The giving of help to those in need who are not related to the giver is practice of **Charity**. As I have discussed last week in my introduction about TRF, The mission of The Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

The Foundation is a not-for-profit corporation supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation who share its vision of a better world. In our district, we have a day exclusively scheduled for giving, which is **The Rotary Foundation Annual Giving Dinner**. It is through the generosity and charitable heart of each Rotarian that can change the world through TRF.

## REGIONAL ROTARY FOUNDATION COORDINATORS

Regional Rotary Foundation coordinators serve as a key resource on all Foundation-related topics, including grants and grants management, fundraising, and programs such as PolioPlus and Rotary Peace Centers. In addition, they:

- RI Encourage Rotarians to continue to support PolioPlus – the highest priority for Rotary International
- Support clubs and districts in their Rotary Foundation fundraising, especially contributions to the Annual Fund
- Teach clubs and districts about Rotary grants

An announcement at the Rotary International Convention in Lisbon, Portugal, set the stage for a bold new chapter in the partnership between Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation in the campaign for polio eradication.

"Going forward, the Gates Foundation will match two-to-one, up to US\$35 million per year, every dollar Rotary commits to reduce the funding shortfall for polio eradication through 2018," said Jeff Raikes, the foundation's chief executive officer, in a prerecorded video address shown during the convention's plenary session on 25 June. "If fully realized, the value of this new partnership with Rotary is more than \$500 million. In this way, your contributions to polio will work twice as hard."

The joint effort, called End Polio Now – Make History Today, comes during a critical phase for the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. The estimated cost of the initiative's 2013-18 Polio Eradication and Endgame Strategic Plan is \$5.5 billion. Funding commitments, announced at the Global Vaccine Summit in April, total \$4 billion. Unless the \$1.5 billion funding gap is met, immunization levels in polio-affected countries will decrease. And if polio is allowed to rebound, within a decade, more than 200,000 children worldwide could be paralyzed every year.

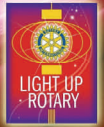
Rotary and the Gates Foundation are determined not to let polio make a comeback.

"We will combine the strength of Rotary's network with our resources, and together with the other partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), we will not just end a disease but change the face of public health forever," said Raikes.

# Comelec guidelines

## Qualification of Candidates

1. He must be a member of the club in good standing.
2. He must have paid all his dues and all other assessments (including Inductions, Anniversaries and Christmas Parties) to the club as of date of election.
3. He must have attended 50% of the regular meeting out of which 50% must be in the home club and provided he has not incurred four (4) consecutive absences.

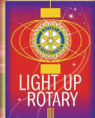
## Voter's Eligibility

1. Only members in good standing as of election date shall be entitled to vote. Members who have paid all his dues and all other assessments (including inductions, Anniversaries and Christmas Parties) are considered members in good standing and will be allowed to vote.
2. Absent members are not allowed to vote (No proxy voting)

## Election Process

1. The annual election shall be held during our club meeting on December 4, 2014
2. Nomination of Officers and Directors shall be presented by the members from the floor during the said meeting or in written form before the election day for all elective positions duly accepted in writing by the nominee.
3. Floor nomination of qualified members to absentia is allowed provided that there is a written acceptance for his nomination that will be submitted to the COMELEC during the election.
4. The position to be voted for are the following: PRESIDENT-NOMINEE, VICE PRESIDENT, SECRETARY, TREASURER AND FIVE (5) DIRECTORS.
5. Members nominated on the floor in any particular position must express personally his acceptance of the nomination before he is considered a candidate.
6. A roll call of members will be done after the closing of nomination for a particular position.
7. Methods of voting in electing the Officers and Directors shall be by SECRET BALLOTING and will be done one (1) minute after finishing the roll call.
8. A candidate who has been voted upon by the majority of the votes cast shall be declared winner in their respective positions.
9. A tie will be broken by a second balloting. If there is another tie on the second balloting, it will be broken by toss coin. One candidate chooses if he will go for head or tail and the other candidates will toss the coin to the floor.
10. In case of second balloting, only voters in the first balloting will be allowed to cast their votes in the second balloting to break the tie; latecomers will not be allowed to vote. Although late comers can still vote in the next position to be voted upon.
11. DECISION OF THE COMELEC IS FINAL unless appealed to the club members whose decision shall be final when reversed or modified by TWO-THIRDS votes of the members within a reasonable period of time as determined by the Board of Directors.



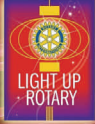

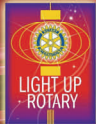

## Basics of Photography: Composition and Technique

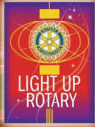
### Frame Your Subject with Objects

A subject against a white background can often be simple and effective if you have a good subject. If you have a boring subject, like an ordinary house, a blank background (like a clear sky) isn't going to be very compelling. Instead, try framing your subject with surrounding objects.

With the house, for example, using nearby trees (or what remains of them) may help. You'll want to make sure the trees don't create lines and shapes that draw your viewer away from the subject (the house), as previously mentioned last week, but often times they can be helpful in making your photograph more interesting and helping to draw the eye where you want it.

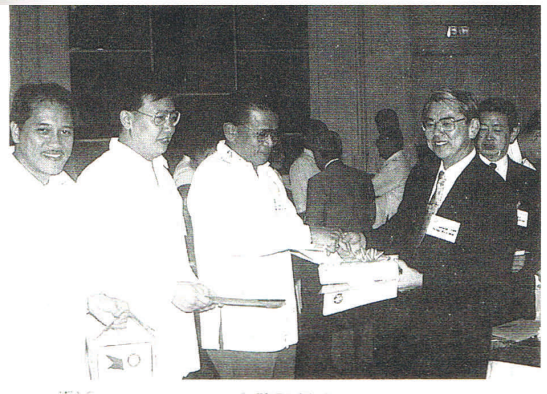

In 2007, the Gates Foundation gave The Rotary Foundation a \$100 million challenge grant for polio eradication, and in 2009, increased it to \$355 million. Rotary agreed to raise \$200 million in matching funds by 30 June 2012, but Rotarians in fact raised \$228.7 million toward the challenge.

"Now is the time for us all to take action: Talk to your government leaders, share your polio story with your social networks, and encourage others to join you in supporting this historic effort," Raikes added. "When Rotarians combine the passion for service along with the power of a global network, you are unstoppable, and the Gates Foundation is proud to partner with you. Let's make history and End Polio Now."
