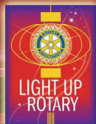

MENDING THE LINGERING EFFECTS OF JAPAN'S TRIPLE DISASTER

More than three years after an earthquake, tsunami, and nuclear disaster triggered widespread devastation in Japan, the physical scars are beginning to mend. Debris has been removed. Coastal communities are being rebuilt. Farming and fishing have resumed, and thousands of people have moved in to new housing.

But the Rotary Clubs of Koriyama West, Japan, and Englewood, New Jersey, USA, are concerned with the emotional and psychological impact caused by the triple disaster, known in Japan as 3/11, which claimed more than 19,000 lives and displaced hundreds of thousands of people.

In a country that prides itself on stoicism, it is difficult for survivors to seek and accept mental health care. "We believe that the first step to overcome the grief is to be able to talk about what they're going through and share their personal experiences," says Englewood club member Ikuyo Yanagisawa.

With a Rotary global grant, the clubs purchased mobile video conference equipment for four mental health clinics in areas most affected by the Fukushima nuclear power plant crisis. These tools now connect mental health care providers in Japan with trauma experts at the Arnhold Global Health Institute in New York City, where psychologists treated survivors and witnesses of the September 11 attacks.

To augment the new resources, Koriyama West members will organize multidisciplinary mental health care teams from Fukushima Medical University to make outreach visits to temporary shelters and schools in and around Tohoku, a town near Fukushima. Additionally, survivors of 3/11 will be able to talk via video conference to 9/11 family members and first responders who lost loved ones and colleagues in the tragedy.

"Despite the differences between 9/11 and 3/11, survivors of both events share a similar healing process by overcoming the shock, grief, and isolation," adds Yanagisawa. Last November, the Englewood club teamed up with Japanese Medical Society of America and American Airlines to fly five members of the September 11th Families Association to Tohoku to share their stories and give encouragement to 3/11 survivors still displaced by the tsunami and Fukushima nuclear disaster.

"The 9/11 members would open each conversation with the Japanese expression *otagaisama* which means 'we are all in the same boat,'" says Yanagisawa, who accompanied the team. "This helped 3/11 members open up more and feel at ease with sharing their story. I could see how deeply connected the two groups were. It was remarkable to see."

Yanagisawa says that 3/11 survivors came to her after group sessions to say how encouraged they were to move forward with their lives.

"This is our [the two participating clubs] goal: to help communities in Japan overcome their grief and find the strength to rebuild their lives," she says. "Bringing together survivors from two different disasters, from opposite ends of the world, we hope will bring about a sense of international community."

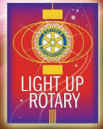

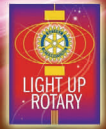

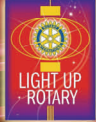

WORLD UNDERSTANDING AND PEACE MONTH

The Rotary Club began World Understanding Month in February as a way to promote peace and international understanding between cultures. World Understanding Month may be the first step for peace that we can all take.

The Rotary began [World Understanding Month](#) in February as a way to promote peace and international understanding between cultures and countries. Rotary Clubs around the globe are asked to plan programs for meetings that will help foster this understanding.

Ideas for the programs may include speakers from other countries or organizing panel discussions with international scholars or exchange students from different countries. It can also be a day for a special project to connect youth of different cultures for a day of service.

So, what does this mean for those of us who aren't Rotarians? Can we still recognize World Understanding Month in February? The answer is yes. The theme for this month is one that we should all work toward every day.

Here are some ideas for you to recognize World Understanding Month in your life.

Organize an international day at work.

Put a note on the bulletin board or send a message by email telling co-workers what you would like to organize. Ask if there are any international co-workers who might be interested in helping.

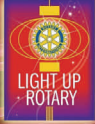
Some possible activities for World Understanding Month in your office are:

- Host an international lunch. Everyone in the office can bring in their favorite international dish. It might be one from their own culture or from a culture they like.
- Ask your local Rotary Club for information about World Understanding Day. They may have brochures or information for a display.
- Put international flags up on the company bulletin board. Add a fact sheet from each country.
- Invite international co-workers to talk for a few minutes about their country over lunch.
- Play a CD of music that represents other countries instead of a radio station.

World Understanding Month can be celebrated in the classroom too:

- Have groups of students study about specific countries and present a report to the class.
- Have the students write an essay about world peace.
- Host an international luncheon for students. (See above.)
- Teacher can ask student parents to talk with the kids about their background.
- Have students color flags that represent other countries.
- Create a bulletin board with a colorful display.
- Have the students write an essay about World Understanding Month in February.
- Invite a speaker from the Rotary Club to speak to the class.

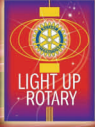

77 photography techniques, tips and tricks for taking pictures of anything

Landscape photography technique 01: using ND grads, strong Neutral Density filters and polarisers

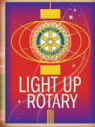


Landscape photographers often carry a range of filters to help them solve exposure problems or achieve an effect that's difficult to recreate in photo editing software.

Although [HDR photography](#) and [exposure blending in Photoshop](#) have reduced the need for ND grads in the field, solid ND filters and polarising filters still have their place in the landscape pro's camera bag.

Solid Neutral Density filters reduce the amount of light entering the lens, [extending shutter speeds for long-exposure landscape photography](#).

[Polariser filters](#) remove reflections from the surface of water and shiny leaves, and boost the contrast between blue skies and white clouds.

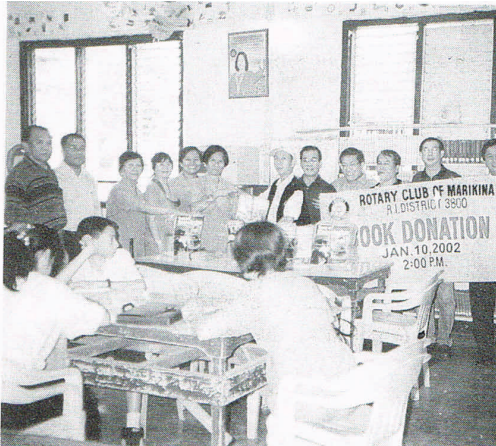
