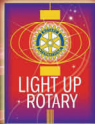

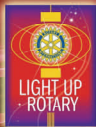

13 Ways Emotionally Intelligent People Deal with Difficult People (part 1)

Becoming successful requires some emotional intelligence. Emotional intelligence offers you the stability to go the long haul. Through this process you meet difficult and toxic people who defy logic and challenge your vitality. Difficult people offer you stress and negativity and could deny you the platform to attain each milestone. Here are some ways in which many emotionally intelligent people deal with difficult people.

1. They establish boundaries

You cannot please everyone neither can you fulfill or meet all their expectations. Emotionally intelligent people do not sell themselves short in this regard. They rise above the chaos and maintain some distance with difficult people.

2. They focus on solutions

Rather than focus on problems caused by difficult people they focus on actions that will better circumstances. There is no point in rambling and going toe to toe with a difficult person's negativity, instead they find how to deal with whatever complications that should be solved.

3. They know their strengths and weaknesses

They know what they can take and what they cannot. They are self-aware of their flaws and strengths and can thus project or channel this in finding the right way when they are met with the stress from a difficult person.

4. They don't forget

Some say experience is the best teacher. The emotionally intelligent person knows this. He knows that a difficult person's prior troubles could give birth to another. Even when they will have to offer a second chance, they try to protect themselves from it through the knowledge they already have.

5. They terminate negative talk

Difficult people are full of criticisms and negativity. Emotionally intelligent people don't listen to this neither do they engage themselves in conversations that will create tensions and stir negative emotions.

6. They don't consume themselves in a fight

Going into a fight with a difficult person could leave them severely damaged, thus they keep and conserve their strength for another day. They know they do not have to respond to every negative emotion a difficult person stirs.

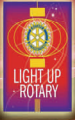

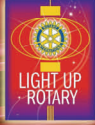

Presidents-elect Training Seminar

The presidents-elect training seminar (PETS) is an opportunity to inspire and prepare incoming club presidents before they begin a year of leading their clubs. This guide has a variety of sessions to provide a comprehensive learning experience for your attendees. The sessions are written for you — the organizers and trainers — to tailor to your training needs.

Purpose

The purpose of this seminar is to:
Prepare incoming club presidents for their role

Give district governors-elect and incoming assistant governors the opportunity to motivate incoming presidents and build their working relationships

Planning

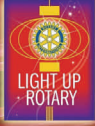
PETS should be held in February or March, preferably for a day and a half, after both the International Assembly and the district team training seminar.

The governor-elect convenes PETS, the district training assembly, the grant management seminar, and the district team training seminar. Districts decide who organizes each meeting. Work with the governor-elect and his or her team to implement the training program.

Participants

All presidents-elect are required to attend PETS unless they are excused by the governor-elect. Presidents-elect who are excused must send a club representative in their place. Other participants should include:

- The district governor-elect, who has overall responsibility for the seminar
- The district governor, who assists the governor-elect with the seminar
- District training committee members, who plan and conduct the seminar under the supervision of the governor-elect
- Assistant governors, who help the governor-elect with team building and goal setting

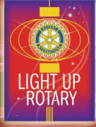

MACRO PHOTOGRAPHY TECHNIQUES, TIPS AND TRICKS

Learn how to choose the best lens, focus for close-up photos and get to grips with depth of field

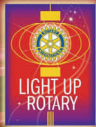


Macro photography technique 01: manual focus

Switch off autofocus when you're taking macro photos. Depth of field (DOF) can be measured in millimetres when you're shooting close-up details, so accurate focusing is critical.

[Manual focusing is made easy with your DSLR's Live View](#). By magnifying the area you want to focus on on the Live View screen and turning the lens's focus ring, you can position the point of focus precisely.

Go easy with the focus ring though, as the difference between razor-sharp and just sharp enough is slight. [You'll also need to use a tripod](#), as even small movements of the camera can throw the focus completely off.

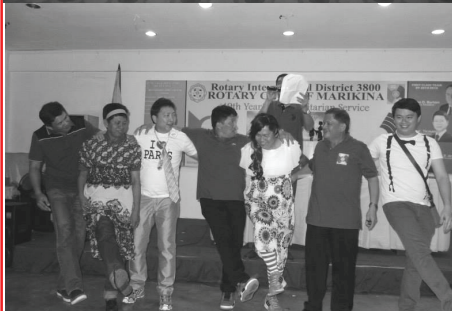
